Dear Resident,

As those living within the vicinity of the M25 will know, the deterioration of the concrete surface between J10-11 is the cause of noise and disruption to many people.

Since this issue was raised with me in December last year, I have been working with the M25 Action Group, residents, Jonathan Lord MP and councillors from Woking and Runnymede Boroughs to highlight this and lobby Government to address this issue. This included delivering a petition, organised by the Action Group led by Cllr Amanda Boote, to 10 Downing Street in March, and highlighting residents' concerns during a Westminster Hall debate in Parliament.

Despite initial views that no further work was expected until at least 2022, we have now received confirmation that work will be carried to replace additional joints later this year. I will continue to work with all involved to press for this to include works on all joints in the concrete surface around J10-11.

I wish to thank Cllr Boote and the members of the Action Group who have campaigned tirelessly to bring about these improvements.
